NEXT WEEK we celebrate PALM SUNDAY



Think about your Lenten journey. In seven days our church will solemnly remember the last days of Jesus' earthly life. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday (also called Passion Sunday) and ends with Holy Saturday and then, the greatest Holy Day - Easter! It is indeed a holy week.

So what will you see in church starting next week on Passion Sunday? Palms - why palms? The word Palm is a symbol of triumph. Palm trees and olive trees were the kind of trees that grew in Jerusalem and it was a custom in Jesus' time for people to wave those kind of branches to honor someone. In John's Gospel, Jesus was hailed as king by people waving palm branches in celebration as he entered Jerusalem. This is remembered on Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday, the priest will bless the palms before we receive them. After this joyful reminder of Jesus riding into Jerusalem, the story of Jesus' Passion (which means suffering) will be read.

One ancient custom is that of giving the church a special cleaning before Palm Sunday. The dirt is swept up from the church floor and scattered in the field in the belief that it will insure good crops. Some say that the annual ritual of housecleaning at spring time came from this Palm Sunday ritual.
