CHRIST THE KING

The feast of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI, in honor of Our Lord as the King of all saints. It is celebrated on the thirty-fourth and last Sunday of Ordinary Time, a solemn homage to him who gave himself completely for us, even to death. It is a preparation for the new liturgical year, which begins with Advent on the following Sunday. The Feast of Christ the King focuses on the inauguration of the kingdom (or reign) of God. Christ the King is a newer solemnity in our Church year.

Before 1969, it was celebrated on the Sunday before All Saints Day, and has only been around since 1925. Christ the King echoes many of the images from the books of Daniel and Revelation. Symbols of Christ the King are: a crown, stole, sheaf of wheat, scepter, throne, ball and cross. In accepting death on a cross, Jesus is a servant king. Even on the cross Jesus shows us the reign of God is intended for all. As followers of Christ, we are called to bear witness to the power of Christ's reign in our lives.

The true meaning of the kingship of Jesus is revealed when he is raised up on the cross. The reign of Christ did not end with his death on the cross; it will last forever. Jesus does not sit on some lofty throne lording his kingship over the universe. Instead, he is on the cross forgiving a penitent thief. Forgiveness is the key to understanding Christ the King. That is what the kingship is really all about: God's gift of forgiveness for those who repent.

The church rejoices and celebrates Christ's triumph over death and evil. The reign of God which is intended for all, is one of peace, love, justice, mercy and forgiveness. Belief in the fulfillment of God's reign is a source of hope for all who believe.
